



Educational equity is sometimes confused with educational equality, but they are not the same. Educational equality is when all students are treated the same and have access to similar resources. Educational equity considers the needs of students as a precursor to and a determining factor for things such as setting policy, the allocation of resources, and the design of educational programs.
